

Descriptions of Jams hosted by the Northern Nevada Bluegrass Association

Moderate/Advanced Bluegrass Jam at Carmelita's Restaurant – A regular Bluegrass Jam for folks that know the Bluegrass repertoire; no music stands or printed materials. Tempos vary --some will be too fast for you; some will be too slow for you. That's Bluegrass!

Beginning Bluegrass Class – Instructor, Cindy Gray. For players of guitar, banjo, mandolin, fiddle, dobro and bass. You should have a basic knowledge of your instrument --- how to tune it, how to strum, pluck, bow or fingerpick it, and basic chords. This class will focus on the Bluegrass repertoire of both singing and instrumental songs. Printed materials and practice recordings provided. Learn proper Bluegrass techniques to get ready for jamming!

All Level Bluegrass Jam – Just what it sounds like. Play Bluegrass songs. Music stands, printed materials are all OK. If people want to split themselves up into separate groups, there are several rooms to do that. Tempos determined by whoever calls each tune. [“Jam Etiquette”](#) followed.
